Mount Sinai Academy Community Agreement

Although parents of Mount Sinai Academy have employed a teacher to help meet their goals, they retain the primary responsibility for the education and upbringing of their children. Experience has shown us that the program provided by Mount Sinai Academy is most beneficial when combined with active, interested, an enthusiastic participation by the parents.

Mount Sinai requires close parent involvement. Each family is asked to do the following;

- Pray for your child, their teacher, and the direction of their education.
- Oversee your child's classwork and work with them on assigned homework.
- Provide diligent instruction on non-academy days and in the additional subjects that comprise the balance of your children's curricula.
- Stay in compliance with all Illinois State Homeschool laws including filing "Intent to Homeschool" with the Illinois State Board of Education and officially withdrawing your student from the local public school district.
- Confer with the student's teacher regularly.
- Be aware of and praise your child's progress.

Mount Sinai Academy Student Fellowship

The Student Rules of Conduct must be read and reviewed by each child before they agree to them in the application.

Parents are expected to communicate in person or by phone with teachers if they have any concerns about behavioral issues in the classroom or on the playground.

Head

- -Hair should not cover the eyes in a way that obscures a student's view of their teacher
- -Hats are only to be worn outdoors.

Tops

- -Solid colored polo shirt
- -Mount Sinai Academy shirt or sweatshirt

Bottoms

- -Jeans or slacks in good condition
- *Leggings, sweats, or other exercise pants are not permitted
- -Skirts that fall below the knee
- -Shorts that fall below the knee will permitted during the hot weather months

Shoes

- -Closed toed shoes, suitable for running and playing during recess
 - *Flip flops and bare feet are not permitted

Christian conduct is expected of students at all times. As we commit ourselves to a code of conduct that glorifies the Lord no matter where we are, it will benefit others as well as ourselves.

Mount Sinai Academy is dedicated to developing young people of Christian character and integrity.

Mount Sinai Academy Discipline Policy

We believe that discipline means to direct or change a person's behavior in an effective and, whenever possible, non-degrading manner. Discipline is a process; therefore, our goal is to help students conduct themselves at all times in a manner becoming of a Christian.

The art of classroom discipline is primarily the responsibility of the teachers at Mount Sinai Academy, and they will handle the bulk of day-to-day behavior skills management.

If a student displays consistent problems, or if there is a single incident of a very serious nature, the teacher will confer with the student's parents to develop a specific plan of action.

Disciplinary options for a student may include...

- Removing the student from class for a set period determined by Mount Sinai Academy teaching staff
- In the event of a serious act of misconduct, it may result in removal from enrollment at Mount Sinai Academy.

*Removal from enrollment is done entirely at the discretion of the Mount Sinai teaching staff.

Mount Sinai Academy Attendance Policy

A student enrolled at Mount Sinai Academy is expected to be present and on time every day classes are in session.

However, we understand that there are many reasons a student might not be present every day class is in session (illness, planned vacations, birth of a new sibling, etc.) So, we ask parents to prayerfully consider any planned absences, and communicate any absences to the teachers as soon as possible.



Short Term Absences

If a student needs to be absent from Mount Sinai Academy for any reason, please contact a teacher using our Remind messaging service, email, or text prior to the beginning of the school day, or as soon as possible.



Extended Absences

We will gladly cooperate with families taking their children from Mount Sinai Academy for vacations, mission trips, etc. For administrative purposes, please submit notice of all planned extended absences in person or through Remind messaging service, or email. Many activities done in the classroom cannot be replicated at home, so please keep this in mind when scheduling vacations during school days.

Make-up Work

Whenever possible, the teachers will provide students with copies of missed work to be completed following an absence. However, many classroom activities are difficult to replicate at home and may need to be skipped in the case of an absence.

Students work each month to earn a 'homework charm' in recognition of completing all assigned work for the month. In instances of work missed due to illness, the teachers may excuse this missed work, allowing for the receipt of that month's homework charm.



Tardiness

Students are asked to arrive and be ready to begin morning prayer and announcements promptly at 9:30 am.

Classroom doors open at 9:30 am to allow students time to arrive and complete any necessary activities (filling up water bottles, using the restroom, hanging coats, etc.) to be ready on time.

Mount Sinai Academy Class Cancellation

Mount Sinai Academy uses the Remind app for all regular and emergency notifications. This allows for quick and easy communication between parents and their teacher. Parents on the app can be contacted via text or email.

Inclement Weather

In the event of snow and inclement weather, Mount Sinai Academy will follow McLean County School District's decision as to school closures. If the McLean County School District delays classes by an hour due to inclement weather, Mount Sinai Academy will be open as usual with no delay. Students who can travel safely should do so. However, if travel is dangerous, then individual students may choose to remain home.

If inclement weather is possible *after the start of class*, parents must be able to check their phones for updates during the school day. If conditions change for the worse, parents will be contacted and asked to pick students up early to ensure they can safely return home.

Location

Mount Sinai Academy meets at Miss Hope's home in Normal, Illinois. It is located down the road from Sugar Creek Elementary School on Hanson Drive. An exact address will be provided to all students and their families upon admission.

Hours of Operation

Mount Sinai Academy serves 2 separate cohorts in order to keep class sizes small. Meeting times are seen below.

Cohort A: Mondays & Tuesdays

Cohort B: Wednesdays & Thursdays.

Class is in session each day from 9:45am-3:30pm. Classroom doors open at 9:30am for arrival until the school day begins.

Orientation is held during the second week of August and both cohorts begin classes the following week.

Mount Sinai Academy observes a Thanksgiving break, Christmas Break, and Spring break. With classes concluding at the end of May.

Mount Sinai Academy Classroom Hours


The classroom doors open at 9:30am. Class begins promptly at 9:45am and ends at 3:30pm.

*Students are not allowed inside the classroom before that time. Students who arrive on campus before 9:30am must be supervised by a parent or carpool parent.

*Students who enter the classroom at 9:30 must stay in the classroom if their parent or carpool parent has left the school campus.



Recess will be held twice a day in Miss Hope's backyard. We will hold recess outside in all weather types (if possible) so bring a jacket for rainy days! Students and families are welcome to stay on campus and enjoy fellowship with one another after class ends, however bathrooms will be unavailable after 4pm.




Mount Sinai Academy Classroom Materials

Parents are responsible for purchasing their student(s) items from the supplies and curriculum lists published each year.

Mount Sinai Academy Home Assignments

Miss Hope will give home assignments to each student to reinforce concepts taught in the classroom. These assignments are expected to be completed at home on non-attendance days. These days are listed below:

Cohort A: Wednesday, Thursday, Friday

Cohort B: Monday, Tuesday, Friday

The principal reasons for home assignments are as follows

- 1. A substantial portion of the curriculum work is independent study (reading, copy-work, daily practice of Latin vocabulary/chants, etc.) that is best done outside of class.
- 2. Students often need some amount of extra practice in new or specific concepts, skills, or facts. In certain subjects, regular practice at home may be necessary for mastery. Therefore, teachers will assign homework to allow for necessary practice.
- 3. Repeated, short periods of practice or study of new information are often a better way to learn than one long period of study.
- 4. Home assignments enable parents to monitor the current topics of study in class and provide supplemental discussion and instruction.



Mount Sinai Academy Age Requirements

Students at Mount Sinai Academy are placed into grade levels based on age. Academic instruction will be appropriately matched to each individual based on grade and ability level.

Students will be placed into grade levels according to their age on the first day of class.



Mount Sinai Academy Family Commitment

New Families

If your family has never had a student attend Mount Sinai Academy in the past, a phone interview may be scheduled after your application has been reviewed.

Returning Families

Returning students and families are given priority to commit to the next school year before new applicants are considered.

Additionally, openings for incoming 3rd grade students are filled first, followed by any openings for 4th and 5th grade students that are available once returning families have had a chance to confirm their return.

Since this is our first year open, we will be filling spots for all grades (3rd, 4th, and 5th). However, in future years vacancies for new students in 4th and 5th grade may be more limited.

Mount Sinai Academy Enrollment Timeline

The enrollment process will begin at the end of January each year. Applications for new or returning students must be submitted before enrollment will be considered.

Mount Sinai Academy Financial Agreement

Mount Sinai Academy is a 10 month financial commitment.

Tuition per student is \$4,000. Payments can be made...

• Annually: \$4,000

• Bi-Annually: \$2,000

• Monthly: \$400

All enrollment and curriculum fees are non-refundable.

There will be no refunds of tuition or fees should you choose to leave Mount Sinai Academy during the academic year or if the student is released due to an unresolvable disciplinary issue.

This policy is considered a "good faith" agreement between Mount Sinai Academy and each family. It allows Mount Sinai Academy to exercise stewardship in managing expenses and provides compensation protection for staff.
